The Community Development Division is responsible for all phases of the grants process, including the preparation of state and federal grants, and administering grant programs. The Division administers the following programs:

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG/CDBG-R)

This program, designed to assist lower income citizens, offers a variety of programs including Youth & Family Counseling, Infrastructure and Commercial Rehabilitation, Residential Rehabilitation, First Time

Homebuyer assistance, Economic Development, and Architectural Barrier removal activities.

Disaster Relief Initiative (DRI)

Provides assistance to homeowners to repair hurricane related damages and may include mitigation activities (hurricane shutters, etc.)

HOME

Funds are provided to eligible homeowners for home repair assistance and rehabilitation activities.

State Housing Initiative Partnership Program (SHIP)

Offers low to moderate income citizens First Time Homebuyer purchase and home repair assistance.

Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP)

This program is designed primarily to alleviate the destabilizing effects of foreclosures. The City acquires, rehabilitates or rebuilds foreclosed or abandoned properties for resale. Additionally, First Time Homebuyer purchase assistance is available for low to moderate income citizens purchasing a foreclosed property within the city limits of Deerfield Beach.

Neighborhood Initiative Program (NIP)

The goal of this program is to provide at risk teenagers with economic help by employing them during the summer, teaching them self esteem, giving them a better understanding of career opportunities, how the business world operates and encourages them to have a more positive outlook on the possibilities for their life paths.

No signs are allowed to be attached to utility poles, trees, fences or City property. The signs shall be less than six square feet and may only be displayed during the hours the sale is conducted.
